
Dear friends,



PROJECTS

THE CLINIC

In 2017, a new clinic (pictured above) was established in Mafubira, Uganda to provide life-saving healthcare to vulnerable children within the community.

At LCM's clinic, a majority of the patients are children treated for burns, which are frequently sustained by cooking over open fires. Additionally, children receive treatment for a variety of illnesses, including malaria, which is prevalent in Uganda.

We could not provide these life saving services without our supporters!



The school in Mafubira was established to: provide impoverished families with the opportunity to send their children to school at a lower cost. LCM sends 37 children to the local school in Mafubira and 35 children attend school in Buluuta.





VOCATIONAL TRAINING

Andrew's Story

Andrew, a Ugandan native, was born in an impoverished family, being the last born out of three children. Andrew stated his parents were not educated and that each member of his family's education did not go beyond the fifth grade. When Andrew and his siblings were young, their mother deserted the family and left their father to take care of them. Their grandmother then took in the children while Andrew's father provided some support however, shortly after, he passed away due to HIV. His father was not able to receive treatment due to their poverty. Andrew's father was very involved with helping Lufafa Emmanuel. Afterwards, family members took care of Andrew and his siblings, but neglected them.



VOCATIONAL TRAINING

Andrew felt his life was going nowhere. *“I used to cry asking God why I was born. God heard my cry.”* Lufafa took Andrew in and cared for him. Lufafa paid school fees and invited Andrew to live with him. Andrew planned on continuing his education, however, with his lack of education throughout the years, school personnel said he was too old to be in school. Andrew decided to put school on pause and focus on some hands on work and pursue dreams of attending mechanic school. He enjoys working with his hands and feels that even though he is not in the typical school setting, he is eager to learn. *“I have a bright future. Thank you.”*

Sixteen children reside in the home and each month donations go to pay for rent, clean water, food, clothing, and other supplies. Hopefully by next year, we will have a children's home built and will no longer have to pay rent.





2017 NUMBERS

IN REVIEW

For 2017, we raised \$20,128 for Children in Uganda.

Our expenses totaled \$2,736.

We are 100 % volunteer operated with 100 % of funds going directly to the children or projects.





FACTS

- o Only 19% of Uganda's population has access to the internet.
- o More than 50% of the female population has experienced violence.
- o Uganda has a primary school drop-out rate of 75%.
- o Uganda has an under-five child mortality rate of 54.6 for every 1,000 children.
- o Though 82% of the population is working, over 70% live in poverty.
- o Only 16% of Uganda's 39 million residents live in urban areas, with the remainder residing in rural areas.
